Why was ROC formed?

The ROC was formed in 1994 as a result of the merger of the Royal Overseas Council and the Royal Overseas Commission. The ROC was formed to provide a forum for the discussion of issues relating to the United Kingdom's overseas territories and to advise the Government on these issues. The ROC is a non-departmental public body, established by the Overseas Territories Act 2002.

Who will be doing the research?
